## ETCC's Role

- ETCC's six utility members collectively serve 85% or more of California's energy users: PG&E, SCE, SCG, SDG&E, SMUD, LADWP
- ETCC began in EE and has grown beyond EE to be a cornerstone of the emerging technologies community in California
  - Well-regarded as source of impartial and market-neutral expertise
  - Conduit to the ETCC Member organizations' technology subject matter experts and program decision-makers
- ETCC has supported the IOU's Energy Efficiency ETP dissemination activities. These activities will transition to the new Gas and Electric Energy Efficiency ETP implementers: ICF and Energy Solutions
- ETCC fills a niche not met by other entities: cross-cutting focus on technologies for various utility customer programs
- ETCC is funded through multiple programs to facilitate coordination across regulatory proceedings
- ETCC has recently transitioned from general EE emerging technologies support to focus on key workstreams across these proceedings
